

Important Parish Features and Views

The most important Parish Features and Views, visible to the general public from roads or footpaths, are protected in the TNP through Policy LHE2 and linked Table 3. They are:-

Visual landmarks and features

1. The River Itchen and adjoining water meadows
2. St Mary's Church and its spire and churchyard
3. Numerous listed buildings along the village edge and at its entrances
4. Twyford Waterworks Scheduled Monument
5. Elevated and sculpted downland within and adjacent to the parish particularly Twyford Down and St Catherine's Hill
6. The high ground at Northfields and Hazeley Enterprise Park
7. The setting of the village in its landscape

Key views of the Parish

8. To listed buildings from the B3335 at the entrance to the village from the south
9. Of St Mary's Church and listed houses on Berry Lane and Church Lane where the landscape provides a distinctive setting
10. To listed buildings along Shawford Road where the landscape provides a distinctive setting
11. Of the River Itchen and water meadows from footpath 10, running southwards from St Mary's Church
12. Of and across the water meadows from Shawford Road
13. From Hunter Park to Gabriels Copse and Footpath 24 across fields to Knighton and Gabriel's Farm
14. Across Churchfields meadow from Churchfields/Finches Lane

Key views from wider landscape

15. St Mary's Church and the northern edge of the village from Shawford Down
16. Long distance views of the landscape from Hazeley Road
17. Views of the village from the numerous public rights of way surrounding the village including Itchen Way and Monarch Way.
